As I sit here thinking of how to start this I am reminded of how it all began. Writing this article began about the same way my recovery did, SLOW. I had a ton of fears, and a little touch of unwillingness. You see I am an alcoholic who wanted to drink without suffering the consequences and accept very little responsibility for the condition of my life. It was everyone and everything else that needed to change. When I came into the rooms of AA I planned on staying for a little while

until I was strong enough to get back out there in the game of life. I found that without a sponsor I was not doing such a hot job of recovering and getting strong again. As my higher power would have it I met my sponsor and my recovery began. Before I knew what was happening I was not drinking and going to a lot of meetings.

The next thing I knew I was sitting in a step meeting on a weekly basis learning about the 12 steps of Alcoholics Anonymous with my sponsor. I had always intended to leave AA as soon as things were good enough in my life and I didn't need AA anymore. My sponsor believes in the 12 steps and believes we are responsible to help another drunk. I didn't really care to help anyone but myself and also thought that any growth was due to my efforts and hard work and I deserved the rewards. But low and behold 3 1/2 yrs into my sobriety (I was just getting ready to quit AA) God sent me my first sponsee. I thought, ok I'll hang out and help her for a bit and then leave. I had no real commitments in AA. I filled in once or twice as a coffee maker and had chaired one meeting. Service is one of those things you hear about, but I had no real interest in.

But now this persons life was in my hands and I had to start taking more of those suggestions. So after careful consideration I decided we should make coffee. My sponsee and I joined what is now my home group and I waited patiently for a commitment to open up. Me and my sponsee showed up every week for a couple of months before my sponsee stopped calling me and quit showing up to meetings. I

thought I'd hang out in our home group and wait for her return. "Surely she will be back" I thought. About a month later my home group gave me a service position of GSR. I thought "Oh my, I just wanted a little coffee commitment" but by that time of 4 1/2 yrs sobriety I had learned that I was to be grateful and accept that position humbly and never say no to AA. I thought I have nowhere to go and the commitment is only 2 yrs, I'll do it. By now the program of AA was rubbing off on me and I was not in such a hurry to leave. I attended my first Area

Assembly Meeting and fell in love with AA.

Through attending District meetings I have become blessed with the position of Literature Chair. I don't know all the ins and outs of that position. But I sure have learned a lot about conference approved literature and nonconference approved. I see the importance of literature not only in AA but in our World. Without literature AA would not have the Big Book or the 12 & 12. To my surprise I am not leaving AA anymore and I care. I love the program of AA and without service I don't know if I would have stayed long enough to get the miracle. My sponsor was right. With a little willingness and action, the fears have left, my higher power can enter. Today I want to and have the privilege to be of service to God and others.

The three-legged dog. During my drinking days when I had a problem, finding someone or something to blame was easy. Feeling put upon or feeling sorry for myself was the norm. It also made me feel better knowing that maybe it wasn't my fault. My parents, the way I was raised or the fact that we didn't have much money? Perhaps my screwed up life was their fault? As I look back, the "poor mes" was a big part of my life. It seemed that life had dealt me a bad hand. I looked at the people around me and felt they had so much more than I did. Filled with envy, I was truly ignorant about life. I felt I was owed something better. Blaming my parents, my wife, my teachers, my kids or the world in general for my circumstances. I knew nothing of serenity. I didn't even know what the word meant until I was in AA for quite a while.



Somewhere along the way, I'm not sure when exactly; I had an experience that changed the way I looked at things. One day as I was sitting on a bench at the park a dog came running by. He was chasing another dog as they played and rolled in the grass. He seemed to be quite happy as they romped all around. As I sat contemplating my own problems I noticed how unusual this dog was. He only had three legs. Yet he was as happy as could be. And as I continued watching I came to realize that the happy little dog didn't even know he only had three legs. He didn't know he should have four legs like the other dogs. And I'm sure he didn't whine about it and blame the other dogs for his misfortune.

It made me see my own problems in a different light. We humans whine and complain forever about our troubles whether they are large or small. We go on and on about them. It seems we can't accept them as part of life and be content with our blessings. We always want more. We want the greener grass. Everything should be perfect. Well, that isn't how the trip goes. Many things happen along the way. The serenity prayer and my AA program have helped me to accept the difficult times and still hold gratitude in my heart. Somewhere in our lives sad times will occur. Things happen to us and to those we love. We need to do the best we can during those times and then continue on with our journey. I believe you can do it.

Think about that three-legged dog, notice how happy he was once he adjusted to his new life. He continues on his journey never even realizing his handicap. Dwelling on how he lost his leg never enters his mind or how things might have been. He just lives one day at a time and makes the most of it. So now when I think of this dog, I know it is not productive for me to sit around dwelling on my past and how I got this way or that.

It is not good to think **what if...**? As the song says "**if is for children**". I find I must live in the real world. So when you feel like having a pity party, I hope you will seriously give some thought to my three-legged dog and notice how he handles life. I am simply saying that when times get tough I look around at others and find many that are worse off than I am and they make me think of that three-legged dog.

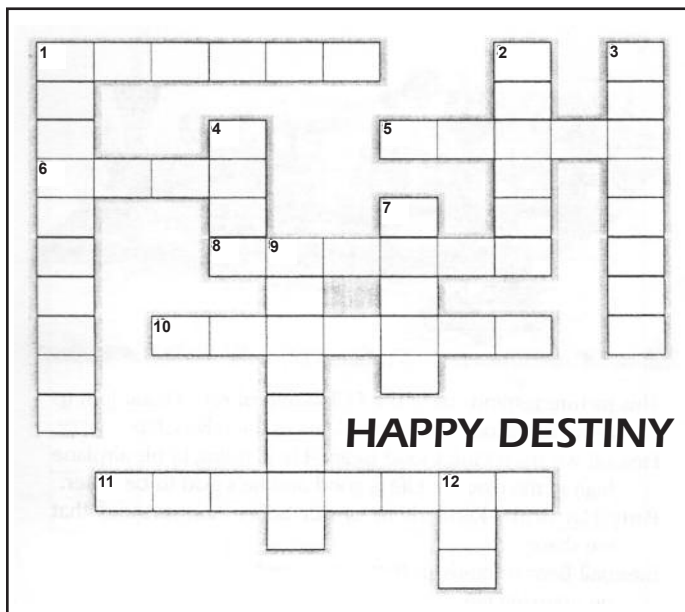

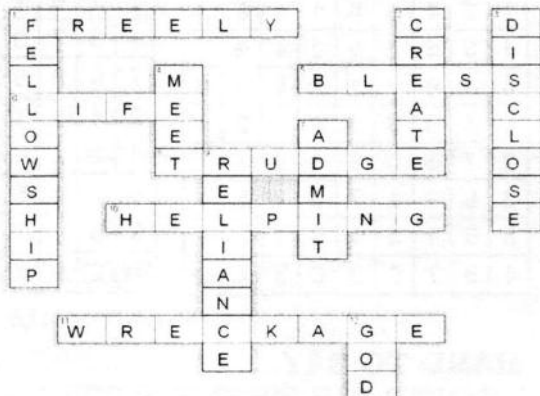
