As an untreated alcoholic it was not in my nature to help anyone unless there was something directly in it for me. Even early in my sobriety, after my sponsor and several others had suggested that I read the chapter "Working With Others," the why of it still wasn't readily apparent to me. I was doing a lot of the right things by making coffee, helping clean up after meetings, giving rides to and from meetings, etc., but I still couldn't understand the value of helping. Finally, I connected the dots when it dawned on me that I was staying sober, and service work was one of the reasons why. Certainly, service work was an integral part of my sobriety that still remains with me today. For me, I see carrying the message and service work as pretty much synonymous, and I use them interchangeably.

Removing the barrier

"What's in it for me?"

Before this sudden realization I had the grandiose notion that for me to practice the 12th Step, I must visit and carry the message to a near-death alcoholic in the hospital. Or, maybe I would have to visit the bar where I did most of my drinking and help sober up some of those poor sots I drank with! While the first scenario is certainly one form of carrying the message (and the second, a complete waste of time), it is by no means the only way to do it. Making coffee, volunteering for service committees, giving rides or taking meetings to hospitals and institutions are all forms of service work.

But what is the connection between doing service work and spiritual growth? For me it's quite

simple. When I do some type of service work, I am relieving me of the "bondage of self." I am removing that barrier that exists between God and me. Without the impediment of selfishness and self-centeredness, I can flourish under the "sunlight of the spirit," and grow along spiritual lines. This leaves very little room for me to get stuck in that age-old question,

"What's in it for me?"

An extension of this growth is that there is something energizing when I get out of myself and get into service work. It brings out the inner joy in me that very few other activities can provide. Finally, the connection that comes from trying to be of maximum service to God and others relieves me of that lonely soul sickness that was so pronounced during my active alcoholism. I now am a part of, rather apart from, and enjoy the fruits of being in the spiritual world.

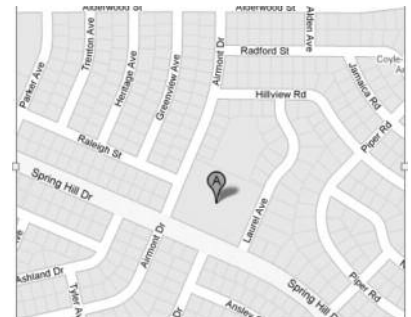


She smiled and replied, "I'm sure of it, but just to be doubly sure, when I get to heaven I'll ask him."

The gathering in Long Beach is notable for a couple of reasons, one being that Bill addressed the crowd of about 8,900 for what Nell Wing, his sec-

retary, said was the longest talk he ever gave—more than two hours. Bill spoke on the development of the Traditions. On Sunday, in the same stadium, Buster Keaton, Jane Mansfield, Dennis Day, and Peggy Lee entertained the crowd—and did so without charge.

For this 25th anniversary celebration of Alcoholics Anonymous Bill W. wrote a 1,000-word press release for the Associated Press in which he says: “Twenty-five years ago I lay in a bed in a hospital in New York City and knew I was doomed to die or go insane—soon.

There was no hope for a man like me, in medicine or in anything else. Like millions of alcoholics in my own time and countless millions throughout the ages, I was approaching a very bitter end.”

A letter from April 1960 to the General Service Board of A.A. from Edward B. Towns of Charles B. Towns Hospital, the hospital Bill refers to in the press release, reads: “I am delighted to have the opportunity to address the Convention on July 1st.... I would appreciate a briefing session on the subject matter of my address so that I will cover the points you desire.”

As with all the International Conventions, the organizing committee invited special guest speakers, such as Mr. Towns, and covered their expenses.
